Our students in Grade 3, achieved exceeding and strong results that were above both similar, network and state schools for Reading, Writing, Spelling and Grammar and Punctuation as well as performing above similar and state schools in Numeracy. Grade 5 results were also outstanding, with students performing above similar, network and state schools in Grammar and Punctuation, above similar and state schools in Reading, Numeracy and Spelling and finally above state school results in Writing. Great results and commendation for the fantastic teaching and learning programs, and due to the amazing teachers that we have here at Parkmore Primary. Well done!














Principal's Report - continued



School Crossing Safety



I have witnessed several students and adults not observing safety expectations when using the school crossing. If your child uses the crossing independently, please discuss these expectations with them.

- •Do not cross the crossing until the crossing supervisor has indicated that it is safe to do so.
- ·Stand behind the yellow line until the crossing supervisor has said you can cross, and cross safely.
- If you are carrying a ball, do not bounce it until you are safely inside the school grounds.
- \cdot At all times, all members of the community must use the crossing when crossing School Road in the vicinity of the school.

I would also like to thank Bea, our school crossing supervisor, who is always there, rain, hail or shine, (braving the elements) to ensure our safety when crossing the road.

Parking and Road Safety



Unfortunately, I have witnessed some parents crossing the road from between parked cars when picking up or dropping of their children. This is an extremely dangerous practice as these are busy times of the day. You are also not modelling good road safety behaviours to our children when doing this. Please always use the manned school crossing.


