WELCOME BACK





WELCOME TO OUR NEW FAMILIES

I would like to extend a sincere welcome to our international families who are joining our community in Term 3. We value the exchange of ideas and cultural information between students, that participating in this program provides. Please don't hesitate to reach out if you need support or information during your time with us. We trust that you and your families will enjoy your stay at Parkmore Primary.

I would further like to extend a warm welcome back to Rory C and his family, who are returning to us. It is great to see you back with the Parkmore PS community and we hope that you are settling in well.

UNIFORM POLICY

It is an expectation and a school policy that all students wear the official school uniform when at school and on school excursions. Second-hand uniform items can be purchased from the school office. There are several students who are not wearing the correct green pants. These can be green tracksuit pants but not leggings unless they are being worn under a school dress. Black pants or leggings are not official school uniform items. If for any reason, your child attends school out of uniform, please send a note to the class teacher with a brief explanation.

It is also a requirement that no make-up is worn whilst in school uniform, this includes any form of face make-up, and nail polish should be clear if worn at all. Coloured nail polish is not permitted.

Headlice particularly enjoy long free flowing and clean hair. To avoid further outbreaks of headlice, it is a requirement that all students with hair longer than shoulder length, have their hair tied back when in school uniform. Beanies and outside jackets/coats should also not be worn in the classroom.

Adhering to our Uniform Policy and wearing the correct uniform items, besides being a requirement, also demonstrates a student's pride in their school. A big shout out to our many students who do attend school wearing the correct school uniform every day!

SEVERAL REMINDERS...

Start and Finish Times

Just a quick reminder that our school day commences at 8.50am. It is during this time that the attendance roll is taken, messages and information for the office is collected and the day's activities are outlined. The day's learning commences at 9.00am. Late arrivals impacts not only on your child's learning but also disrupts the class. We discourage students arriving before 8.30am. Yard supervision commences at 8.45am. Students who arrive early or are collected after 3.45pm, must be enrolled in the before and after school care program, TheirCare. Yard supervision concludes at 3.45pm. Students who have not been collected by this time, must wait in the office area, while their parents are contacted. Students who have been collected by their parents and who are continuing to play in the playground/oval areas of the school, must be directly supervised by their parents.

It is important that students are on time and do not miss class unnecessarily, either through unauthorised absences or by being late or leaving early. We value education highly at Parkmore Primary School. School absence reflects missed opportunities for learning.









Principal's Report - continued

School Crossing

The school crossing is manned each school day by our very capable School Crossing Officer, Bea, who ensures the safe crossing of the very busy Jolimont Road for not only our students but also members of our community and the public. Unfortunately, I have witnessed some parents crossing the road from between parked cars when picking up or dropping off their children. This is an extremely dangerous practice as before and after school are busy times of the day. We are also not modelling good road safety behaviours to our children when we do this. Please use the manned school crossing at all times.

Staff Car Park

Please do not park in the Staff carpark or use it as a thoroughfare to the school office. The carpark can be very busy at all times of the day, and drivers do not expect to see toddlers or children in the car park. Unfortunately, I have seen several near misses, particularly when delivery trucks are coming and going.

Assemblies

Our assemblies will continue to be held at 9.00am fortnightly, on alternate Wednesday mornings, commencing this term from Wednesday 30 July. We enjoy seeing our many parents and members of our community attend. Our student leaders present our 'Student of The Week' and any other awards, announce community events, and highlight student achievement and celebrate what is happening in our classrooms.

PHONE /SMART WATCH POLICY

During 2020 the State Government enacted a DET School Phone policy that mandated that mobile phones and smart watches carried/worn by school students must be handed in to their class teacher, upon the student's arrival at school each morning, to be stored safely in the school office during the day. These devices can be collected by the student at the end of the day. If students are found to possess a phone or smart watch during school hours, these items will be confiscated, and parents will be contacted. This policy also applies to personal iPads or any gaming device, unless otherwise authorised by the Principal. A copy of the policy can be made available on request.

TERM EVENTS

We have a short term this term, which ends on Friday 19 September. However, it is also going to be quite a busy term with many upcoming events including our popular book week (and book week parade); the Scholastic Book Fair; the Preps 'First 100 Days'; the District Winter Sports Days and then Summer Sports Days for the upper grades throughout the term; the Grade 5/6 Hoop Time; the Ceres Excursion for the Grades 3-6; the Sustainability Incursion for the Grade 3/4; the Fire Ed Incursion for the Preps, to name a few of the activities! I'm already exhausted just thinking about them. Please make sure that you have your Compass app downloaded onto your device as this is our main avenue for communicating information about any school events and activities, to our families.

SUN HATS



As we are a 'SunSmart' school and in line with the DET 'SunSmart' policy, it is a requirement that all students wear the SunSmart approved school hat, always, when outdoors from August $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ in Term 3, and during Terms 1 and 4. To protect your child from sunburn we do request that you apply sunscreen to your child each morning. It is also a good idea to supply your child with a small tube of sunscreen in their school bag. Whilst we are not permitted to dispense sunscreen we can support and assist younger children to apply sunscreen throughout the day.


Friday the 22nd of August is book week dress up day! Please dress up as your favourite character from your favourite book. Fiction or Non-fiction, you can go as anything!
