

Our students achieved above State results in all areas of the curriculum in both the Grade 3 and Grade 5 results. In many of the areas we achieved excellent results that were above similar, network as well as the state.

All students achieved at or above the proficient level in NAPLAN except for two students across both Grade 3 and 5, recorded as 'needing additional support' in several of these areas. These students are supported with intervention learning and a targeted Individual Education Plan.



A huge well done to all of our District Athletics students! We are so proud of you!




